They will be with us until the end of term and we hope they have an enjoyable time during their time with us at Palmerston.

Thank you for all your generous donations towards our Harvest Festival. The Year 5 class assembly was wonderful and a chance for families to celebrate and share their children's learning so far this year. We really value the time you give to see what goes on in school

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and the children have really benefitted from talking about their learning journeys. Every child will have an opportunity to share their learning with their families after their class assembly. The whole school has also thoroughly enjoyed working on a wellbeing project led by the amazing Jordan Forse - a wellbeing mural celebrating this will be installed before the end of Autumn term.

We are always looking to improve our systems and appreciate constructive feedback. Thank you so much for taking the time to give us feedback through the questionnaires we shared at the pupil progress meetings.
